THE CILT(UK) LEVEL 5 PROFESSIONAL DIPLOMA PROGRAMME

The CILT(UK) Professional Diploma is a self-standing Level 5 qualification for individuals already working within the logistics and transport profession who wish to develop a strategic view of logistic and transport operations and to become capable of reviewing operational activities.

The CILT(UK) Professional Diploma is aimed typically at candidates holding middle management positions in specialist functional areas such as Supply-Chain Management, Transport Operations, Transport Planning, Warehousing, Procurement, Production Planning and Inventory Management. The CILT(UK) Professional Diploma is also a suitable level of qualification for graduates entering the logistics and transport profession for the first time.

European Accreditation and certification of the CILT(UK) Professional Diploma is available from the European Certification Board for Logistics (ECBL) in Brussels. Candidates will be able to carry designatory letters after their name: **ESLog - European Logistician Senior Level**.

STRUCTURE OF THE CILT(UK) PROFESSIONAL DIPLOMA PROGRAMME

Candidates must complete a total of 4 units. Completion of the Core Management unit and one elective unit is mandatory but candidates must select 2 other additional optional units. The elective unit will determine the affinity of the qualification in terms of Supply Chain, Transport Operations or Transport Planning. The 2 additional option units can be selected from any of the full range of options, not just from those relating to the to the elective unit that has been selected. Additionally, one other elective unit may also be selected as an option.
